rembrandt was the most famous painter of the dutch golden age and the opportunity to work in his studio attracted young artists for nearly four decades until the artist s death in 1669 this catalogue explores the workings of rembrandt s studio in the form of drawings made by the master himself and fifteen of his pupils rembrandt and his students would often depict the same subject matter as an exercise and make drawings of the same nude models in his later years rembrandt also made sketching trips outside amsterdam to create his innovative landscapes of the dutch countryside his students followed this example sometimes depicting the same sites organized chronologically drawings by rembrandt and his pupils telling the difference is a groundbreaking study that presents more than forty works by rembrandt and related works by his pupils it explores the scholarship of recent decades that has brought new and more systematic criteria to bear on determining the authenticity of rembrandt drawings and defines the styles of his pupils and followers with ever greater precision in so doing this volume demystifies the sometimes baffling exercise known as connoisseurship and seeks to re enact the daily practices that rembrandt used to teach his students and bring them to artistic maturity this is an essential book for anyone interested in the dutch golden age or the lives and careers of rembrandt and the artists in his immediate circle a major exhibition of these drawings will be on view at the j paul getty museum from december 8 2009 to february 28 2010 book jacket

j paul getty began collecting old master paintings in the 1930s he founded his malibu museum in the early 1950s and continued to contribute to its collections until his death as he left the museum generously endowed major works of art have continued to be acquired mr getty s personal preferences inclined toward renaissance and baroque painting of the italian and netherlandish schools with some excursions into the art movements of the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries the masterpieces reproduced here show the care which he and the museum trustees have devoted to the formation of a new museum s collection the j paul getty museum s new building was opened to the public in january 1974 it is a replica of the villa dei papiri excavated at herculaneum and provides a spectacular setting for the collection of classical antiquities the paintings collection is housed in more conventional galleries on the second floor

imagination has long been regarded as central to c s lewis s life and to his creative and critical works but this is the first study to provide a thorough analysis of his theory of imagination including the different ways he used the word and how those uses relate to each other peter schakel begins by concentrating on the way reading or engaging with the other arts is an imaginative activity he focuses on three books in which imagination is the central theme surprised by joy an experiment in criticism and the discarded image and shows the important role of imagination in lewis s theory of education he then examines imagination and reading in lewis s fiction concentrating specifically on the chronicles of narnia the most imaginative of his works he looks at how the imaginative experience of reading the chronicles is affected by the physical texture of the books the illustrations revisions of the texts the order in which the books are read and their narrative voice the storyteller who becomes almost a character in the stories imagination and the arts in c s lewis also explores lewis s ideas about imagination in the nonliterary arts although lewis regarded engagement with the arts as essential to a well rounded and satisfying life critics of his work and even biographers have given little attention to this aspect of his life schakel reviews the place of music dance art and architecture in lewis s life the ways in which he uses them as content in his poems and stories and how he develops some of the deepest most significant themes of his stories through them schakel concludes by analyzing the uses and abuses of imagination he looks first at moral imagination although lewis did not use this term schakel shows how lewis developed the concept in that hideous strength and the abolition of man long before it became popularized in the 1980s and 1990s while readers often concentrate on the christian dimension of lewis s works equally or more important to him was their moral dimension imagination and the arts in c s lewis will appeal to students and teachers of both children s literature and twentieth century british writers it will also be of value to readers who wish to compare lewis s creations with more recent imaginative works such as the harry potter series

from t j clark comes this provocative study of the origins of modern art in the painting of parisian life by edouard manet and his followers the paris of the 1860s and 1870s was a brand new city recently adorned with boulevards cafes parks great exhibitions and suburban pleasure grounds the birthplace of the habits of commerce and leisure that we ourselves know as modern life a new kind of culture quickly developed in this remade metropolis sights and spectacles avidly appropriated by a new kind of consumer clerks and shopgirls neither working class nor bourgeois inventing their own social position in a system profoundly altered by their very existence emancipated and rootless these men and women flocked to the bars and nightclubs of paris

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went boating on the seine at argenteuil strolled the island of la grande jatte enacting a charade of community that was to be captured and scrutinized by manet degas and seurat it is clark s cogently argued and profusely illustrated thesis that modern art emerged from these painters attempts to represent this new city and its inhabitants concentrating on three of manet s greatest works and seurat s masterpiece clark traces the appearance and development of the artists favorite themes and subjects and the technical innovations that they employed to depict a way of life which under its liberated pleasure seeking surface was often awkward and anxious through their paintings manet and the impressionists ask us and force us to ask ourselves is the freedom offered by modernity a myth is modern life heroic or monotonous glittering or tawdry spectacular or dull the painting of modern life illuminates for us the ways both forceful and subtle in which manet and his followers raised these questions and doubts which are as valid for our time as for the age they portrayed

two thousand years ago artworks of astonishing variety were being created in far flung regions of the world although some of the cultures flourishing in the year one such as that of rome are well known others may be less familiar in europe celtic peoples excelled in intricate metalwork and in egypt a fascinating hybrid combining greco roman and age old egyptian styles predominated east of the mediterranean such wealthy centers of trade as palmyra petra the kingdoms of southern arabia and the mighty parthian empire produced a wide range of sculpture ceramics and precious metal objects that served both religious and luxury purposes as well as everyday uses continuing eastward from parthia to what is now afghanistan pakistan and northern india a traveler in the year one would have discovered the eclectic arts of the kushan empire where a distinctive early buddhist art sometimes incorporated influences from greece and rome in east asia china s great empire under the han dynasty was home to sophisticated arts in every medium seminomadic peoples in northern china made metalwork ornaments often to adorn the gear for their horses and characteristic arts had begun to develop in korea and japan the elegant bronzework produced in southeast asia testifies to a fertile artistic interchange in that region finally in cultures across the pacific ocean in south america and mesoamerica powerful and expressive objects were made of stone ceramic and gold more than 150 works of art that exemplify all these societies at the year one are illustrated in color and fully explained in this volume historical summaries accompanied by maps briefly describe the nature of each culture and the flow of power and peoples during the period centering around the year one an introductory essay offers both an overview and an account of the startling degree to which the ancient world was an interconnected one crisscrossed by intrepid traders and adventurers who journeyed both east and west to bring back coveted goods and tantalizing scraps of information about exotic lands the works of art included here are almost all in the collections of the metropolitan museum of art in new york the book s authors are members of the museum s curatorial staff representing seven different departments this title was originally published in 2000 01

long after painting sculpture photography and film developed along with their materials canvas and panel marble and bronze and celluloid film a new generation of art has emerged in which digital electronic architectural and performative materials have offered new forms for creative expression and experience in much of this new art the medium no longer composed of passive materials now embraces and challenges viewers to work as co creators of aesthetic experience starting from the impossibility of understanding this new and complex art solely within the framework of contemporary art history and criticism the engagement aesthetic offers new modes of critique for new media works of art literature and performance that operate in complex ways blending a range of methodologies from phenomenology art history linguistics and statistical analysis ricardo explores how a new kinship between individual participation electronic media virtual and actual space and mediated language results in a new aesthetic of mutual engagement
