the present volume of the history of al Ṭabarī deals with the years 14 and 15 of the islamic era which correspond to a d 635 637 the nascent islamic state had just emerged victorious from the crisis that followed the prophet s death in 632 and had suppressed what was known as the riddah apostasy rebellion in the arabian peninsula under the leadership of ʿumar ibn al khaṭṭāb the second caliph or successor to the prophet muhammad the muslims embarked on the conquests that would soon transform the whole of the middle east and north africa into an arab empire most of the present volume describes the battle of al qādisiyyah which took

place on the border between the fertile iraqi lowlands al sawad and the arabian desert and resulted in the decisive defeat of the persian army the muslim victory at al qādisiyyah heralded the downfall of the sasanian dynasty which had ruled persia and mesopotamia since a d the third century it also paved the way for the conquest of iraq and facilitated islamic expansion in persia and beyond the volume also deals with the conquest of syria and palestine and the expulsion of the byzantines from those regions particular attention is devoted to the traditions related to the conquest of jerusalem at the hands of ‘umar ibn al khaṭṭāb the first muslim prayer on the temple mount and its transformation into an islamic sanctuary the volume contains colorful descriptions of the various battles expatiations on the bravery of the muslim warriors and portrayals of the futile negotiations between the parties before the beginning of hostilities it thus provides the reader with a fascinating insight into the later muslim traditions related to those crucial events of early islamic history

the pictish defeat of the northumbrians is arguably the most important turning point in scottish history waged on saturday 20 may 685 the battle of dunnichen fought near forfar in northeastern scotland is the best documented event in the history of the pictis this bloody engagement pitted the pictish army of bridei son of beli king of fortriu against that of his cousin ecgfrith son of oswig king of the northumbrian angles the pictish victory was complete ecgfrith was killed along with the flower of his army and the pictish kingdom of fortriu emerged from dunnichen as the dominant kingdom in north britain for generations to come during which time its kings laid the foundations of the medieval kingdom of scotland it is for this reason that the battle of dunnichen is mentioned in the same breath as the more famous battles of stirling bridge and bannockburn and has long been seen as a pivotal moment in the history of the scottish nation

## The Art of War in Spain

the 1492 conquest of granada in southern spain is crucial to a proper understanding of the development of western european warfare the culmination of a long struggle between the muslim and christian cultures in western europe it was the training ground for the armed forces that were to make spain the dominant military power in europe throughout the sixteenth century it also set the stage for the discovery of the new world it was the war that had to be won before ferninand and isabella would agree to sponsor columbus s momentous voyage william prescott s absorbing account of the war of granada is now set in context by albert d mcjoynt who examines the role of the conquest of granada in spanish warfare and its influence on western european military histories in english have tended to neglect spain s experience in granada causing a critical gap in awareness of the factors that led to its military strength in europe after the italian wars of the late fifteenth and early sixteenth centuries far from merely copying their adversaries techniques during these wars as has often been assumed the spanish armed forces had already adopted most of the advances that took spanish warfare from the medieval to early modern stage

including a chapter on post war jerusalem prose that is as graphic as it is lucid the battle for jerusalem is deservedly acclaimed as a classic of its genre prof howard m sachar author of a history of israel extraordinarily dramatic prof edward n luttwak author of strategy the logic of war and peace abraham rabinovich arrived in jerusalem five days before the six day war as a reporter for an american newspaper he covered the battle for the city and was on the temple mount a few hours after its capture to understand the momentous events he had witnessed he subsequently interviewed 300 soldiers officials and civilians the conquest of the old city a major event in modern middle east history was something that israel s leaders had not planned and that some of them did not want the book was written soon after the war when memories were fresh the current revised edition expands the context political and military and offers new perspective from both sides of the battlefield with the outbreak of war with egypt israel sought to avoid a second front hours after jordan opened artillery fire israel refrained from substantive retaliation as it sought a cease fire only after jordanian troops penetrated the jewish city did israel respond on the ground and even then in measured stages the israeli cabinet was divided over capture of the old city it was surprisingly the religious ministers who argued against it most vigorously they feared that israel could not stand up to international pressure if it annexed an entity that was not just the cradle of jewish history but also sacred to christianity and islam however events created a vacuum on the west bank into which israel was inexorably pulled step by step we witness the heated debate in jordanian military headquarters where king hussein had handed over command of his army to an egyptian general the latter s strategy was designed to meet egypt s needs not jordan s it would cost jordan the west bank the book begins with a description of jerusalem as a divided city split between israel and jordan since israel s war of independence with the onset of the crisis in 1967 anxiety grips israeli jerusalem which had been besieged for months in the earlier war and elaborate emergency measures are set into motion on the arab side of the city by contrast there is euphoria and anticipation of an easy victory virtually nothing is done to prepare the civilian sector the israeli general staff pushes for a pre emptive air strike against egypt but the government resists tensions reach a point where at least one general ariel sharon considers the possibility of a putsch the appointment of moshe dayan as defense minister opens the way to war defense of israeli jerusalem is entrusted to the jerusalem brigade made up of local reservists the greatest concern is mount scopus an israeli enclave behind jordanian lines an israeli armored brigade is dispatched from the coastal plain with orders to reach scopus by flanking the jordanian line it would have to breach thick minefields and scale difficult terrain as it races a brigade of jordanian tanks coming up from jericho with time pressing a paratroop brigade is ordered to relieve scopus by driving through the center of the jordanian defenses the reader follows the grueling battles in the trenches of ammunition hill and the streets of east jerusalem through the eyes of the men who fought there we see the growing isolation of the jordanian garrison in the old city their last bastion in a room lit only by distant flares the jordanian commander informs the local governor that he is pulling his troops out a number of soldiers choose to remain and engage the israeli troops from the alleys and ramparts of the walled city a classic tale

in october 1917 an invasion force of some 25 000 german soldiers accompanied by a flotilla of 10 dreadnoughts 350 other vessels a half dozen zeppelins and 80 aircraft attacked the baltic islands of dago osel and moon at the head of the gulf of riga it proved to be the most successful amphibious operation of world war i the three islands fell the gulf was opened to german warships and was now a threat to russian naval bases in the gulf of finland and 20 000 russians were captured the invasion proved to be the last major operation in the east although the invasion had achieved its objectives and placed the germans in an excellent position for the resumption of warfare in the spring within three weeks of the operation the bolsheviks took power in russia november 7 1917 and albia faded into obscurity as the war in the east came to a slow end
