handwriting is a necessary skill for children that will serve them throughout their lives which is why it is so important handwriting has the following benefits 1 handwriting facilitates children s cognitive development when characters are written on paper with a pen or pencil the brain is focused on one thing which helps fix the written material in memory 2 handwriting essential in children s psychomotor development when children learn to write by hand they learn to coordinate their arm hand and finger muscles to make different movements develop fine control of movements and dexterity 3 handwriting makes reading easier 4 handwriting helps develop language help your child to have a correct writing posture from the very beginning here are some tips 1 colours attract the attention of young children so to encourage writing choose colorful notebooks and pens 2 try to include writing in your child s activities e g if they are drawing ask them to write a short description of the drawing 3 posture is very important when your child is writing so make sure they have the correct posture head should be up and not bent back should be straight opposing hand resting on the table left hand relaxed shoulder relaxed and wrist supported but not forced opposing hand should be used to hold the notebook paper so that the writing hand is free to handle the pen 4 as for the writing instrument it should be held at an angle of 60 degrees to the sheet of paper with 3 fingers 2 3 cm away from the base without applying pressure to the writing instrument this book contains 123 pages of which 120 are blank

forty years ago 96 percent of six year old children were enrolled in first grade or above as of 2005 the figure was just 84 percent the school attendance rate of six year olds has not decreased rather they are increasingly likely to be enrolled in kindergarten rather than first

grade this paper documents this historical shift we show that only about a quarter of the change can be proximately explained by changes in school entry laws the rest reflects academic redshirting the practice of enrolling a child in a grade lower than the one for which he is eligible we show that the decreased grade attainment of six year olds reverberates well beyond the kindergarten classroom recent stagnation in the high school and college completion rates of young people is partly explained by their later start in primary school the relatively late start of boys in primary school explains a small but significant portion of the rising gender gaps in high school graduation and college completion increases in the age of legal school entry intensify socioeconomic differences in educational attainment since lower income children are at greater risk of dropping out of school when they reach the legal age of school exit contains 9 footnotes and 8 figures
